### TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

Fayson Lake Water Company, Inc., hereinafter "Petitioner," is a New Jersey corporation and a public utility providing water service in Kinnelon, New Jersey. Its office is maintained at 160 Boonton Avenue, Kinnelon, New Jersey. 07405. This petition is submitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, N.J.S.A. 48:2-21.1, and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12 to increase its rates for water service to its customers and to make other related tariff changes. In support of its request for relief Petitioner states:

1. Petitioner was authorized to be a public utility by order of the Board of Public Utilities, hereinafter "Board," in July 1957. Petitioner provides water service to approximately 890 customers in the Borough of Kinnelon, Morris County.

2. The proposed revised tariff sheets (including a second redlined version showing the changes) containing the rate increases is submitted herewith as Exhibit L. Said tariff reflects an increase in rates to enable the petitioner to meet the expenses of its operation, recover a reasonable rate of return on the investments used in its public utility operations,

and meet the debt coverage requirements of its financing. The proposed increase is designed to produce additional revenues of \$ 262,048 per year or 37.27% over existing annual revenues.

3. Petitioner had a change in rates approved by the Board effective September 27, 2018 in Docket No. WR11710104. Since that time, the rates have not been sufficient to provide for the operating expenses necessary to provide for safe, adequate, and proper public utility service. Petitioner seeks just and reasonable rates to correct the current revenue deficiencies.

4. Since 2018, Petitioner has also made the following major three additions to its plant, which is a significant part of why its current rates are insufficient.

### a. Water main replacement 2020 Waters Edge.

In 2020, the Company replaced the water mains and the line off the main to edge of the customers property on Water's Edge Street. There were many leaks in this section and the old pipe was undersized and did not have any flushing points -- something needed to provide better quality water. Also, many valves in the street did not work or leaked after turning them. The Company installed 485 feet of pipe, 9 new curb stops, 2 fire hydrants for fire protection, and 4 new valves to isolate streets. The Company saved money on paving the road by coordinating with the town 2020 paving program. Thus, the Company only had to patch pave the roads. This project is complete and in service.

### b. Water main replacement 2023 Lakeside Trail and Sylvan Trail.

The Company decided in 2023 to replace the water mains and the line off the main to edge of the customers property on the streets by Lakeside Trail and Sylvan Trail section. The Company had many leaks in this section and the old pipe was undersized. Many

valves in the street did not work or leaked after turning them. The Company had to replace the line because it had some galvanized pipe that is considered lead. In addition, this project will improve water quality by having new pipes that are less prone to corrosion, which helps maintain the clarity and purity of the water. The Company installed 5,970 feet of pipe, 90 new curb stops, 10 fire hydrants for fire protection and 45 new valves to isolate streets. The Company saved money on paving the road by coordinating with the town paving 2024 paving program thereby only having to patch pave the roads. This project is complete and in service.

### c. Telemetry update of the HMI 2023.

The company decided in 2023 to update the computer that runs the plant. It had a pc with windows 7 running the plant and software that was outdated. The new software needed to be put on a new PC running windows 11. The Company now can remotely observe the usage of water in the system each day, which increases information to track leaks. This project is complete and in service.

5. Construction of the pipeline (item 4.b. above) resulted in a substantial addition to the Petitioner's debt. The rate relief requested in this case is designed to provide adequate rates, including sufficient revenues to meet the coverage requirements under the debt arrangement.

6. Copy of and notice of the filing of this petition is being given to the Clerk of the Borough of Kinnelon, the Morris County Administrator, the Morris County Board of Chosen Freeholders, New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel, and the New Jersey Division of Law.

7. The proposed tariff is dated March 12, 2024, to become effective April 11, 2024.

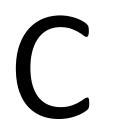
